Being ready to share

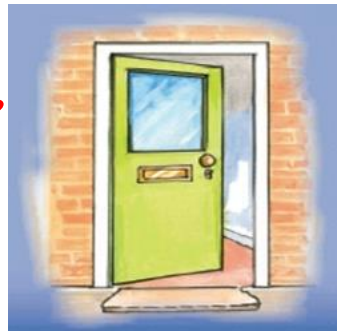
Being fair to others.
