Engage

We will take it in turns to sing our favourite nursery rhymes to the class, nursery rhyme karaoke. We will learn and sing 'If you're happy and you know it' and read the book. We will look at how the rhyme has been changed and the different actions the animals make. We will think of different animals and what we think they would do in the song. We will add new actions and emotions to the song together. The theatre group 2 Boards and a Passion will come and inspire the children with their innovative way to sing and play with nursery rhymes,

Develop

Can you tell me a nursery rhyme? To answer this question, we will learn to sing and sign a variety of different nursery rhymes.

We will sing Old Macdonald together, and learn about the names of different farm animals and the sounds they make.

We will learn to sing the rhyme, Row row row your boat. We will use props to create a boat and use them

to role play the rhyme and make up our own boat stories. We will try making our own boats from junk modelling to float in the water tray?

We will learn to sing Jack and Jill, and explore what happens to the meaning of the rhyme if you change the rhyming words. We will role play being doctors, nurses and patients.

We will learn the rhyme, The Wheels on the Bus. We will role play going on a bus ride. Where would they like to go on a bus?

We will learn a variety of number rhymes. We will learn to count and represent numbers on our fingers. We will use objects to retell the rhymes.

Innovate

We will make a book of our favourite nursery rhymes. We will record ourselves singing our favourite rhymes.

Express

We will share what we have learnt about nursery rhymes by inviting our parents in to hear us sing and sign the rhymes.

Persevering

The Persevering Pirates will be helping us to keep going on in the face of difficulties, challenging the energy of frustration productively. We will try and try again to put on our own coats, as the weather gets colder.

Empathy

We will learn about the Zones of Regulation, and widen our scope of feelings words. We will use Empathy Emma to help us think about how others are feeling by looking at expressions and body language. We will think about how the characters in the nursery rhymes must have felt.

Nursery Reminders

You can help your child to achieve their best and enjoy their learning by:

- talking with your child about what they have done at school.
- talk about the word of the day and use it when playing and talking together at home and when out and about.
- encouraging them to be independent e.g. putting on their own coat, doing own buttons and zips.
- helping them to recognise their name.
- helping them to write their name independently.
- counting objects up to 5 and then 10. Noticing numbers around the house and environment.
- trying new activities and challenges with them, encouraging them to show perseverance through trying and trying again.
