Our Vision for Music in our School is:

'A School without music is a school without a soul' Don Bosco

Music is a powerful, unique form of communication that can change the way we feel, think and act. It brings together intellect and feeling and enables personal expression, reflection, emotional and spiritual development. As an integral part of culture, past and present, it helps pupils understand themselves and others, forging important links between the home, school and the wider world. The teaching of music develops pupils' ability to listen and appreciate a wide variety of music, to explore sounds and use their imagination and creativity to make their own music, and to develop the confidence to perform for others.



God created us to be instruments with the ability to sing and make music; we believe at St George's that music is an important part of a child's development and so it is an integral part of our everyday life. We want our pupils to foster a love of music and understand the positive effect it can have on our wellbeing. Throughout our curriculum, pupils have the opportunity to experience music in a variety of forms and to explore it through a range of contexts, exploring music through listening, creating and performing as individuals and as groups. Music is also an important part of worship and praise to God, so is incorporated into daily worship sessions.



Music at St George's is taught through the National curriculum and the skills of progression to ensure we build on previous skills and learning. The 'St George's Music approach' outlines the key elements for the teaching and Learning of music. Teaching is linked to our Learning Challenges where appropriate and is shared through real life performances where possible. We use specialist teachers, where possible, to enhance the opportunities and experiences we offer our children in order that they can explore and enjoy music to its full. We also invite other musicians into school who willingly share their enthusiasm for singing and other forms of music. We offer extra-curricular music opportunities: Music club, Junior choir and guitar lessons which are available to all children. We continually look for opportunities for our children to take part in music activities outside of school - in the local community and further afield - broadening their experiences and love of music.

Our six principles for the teaching of music are:

- Using creativity and imagination to become a composer
- Using musical vocabulary to express feelings and emotions
- Sharing a love of singing
- Learning to play different instruments and practising to get better
- Listening to different styles of music including live and recorded
- Having fun exploring sounds and building confidence to perform


