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Back to School Reminders

When we come back in September, we expect all pupils to wear the school uniform as a mark of respect for the school and to show they belong to St George's School family. **ALL ITEMS MUST BE CLEARLY NAMED.** Please keep checking weekly that the name does not wear off throughout the year if you use pen, we have lots of uniform in school with no names on.

Reminders!

Children from Reception upwards are expected to wear smart, sensible black shoes as part of their school uniform. Trainers are not allowed at St George's as everyday footwear, although Junior children may wear trainers for outside PE lessons. **Uniform** can be bought online through **Kids Stop**, 49 Market Street, Hyde.

If your child has any **medication** in school, please ensure that new up to date medicines are sent in with your child's name on when we return.

No jewellery including earrings. If you are planning to have your child's ears pierced then please do it at the beginning of the summer holiday, so they are able to remove the earrings before coming back to school in September.
Dinner Money - Payments must be made on a Sunday night/Monday morning. If you are changing the type of lunch your child has from September please inform the office before the 5th September so we can let Mrs France the school cook know numbers. If you think your circumstances have changed and you might now be entitled to Free School Meals ask the office for a form and we can check for you.
