Learning Challenges

Engage We will use pictures of objects, people and places of worship related to different celebrations and play pass the bag around the circle. What celebration is it? Have the children seen it? Experienced it? Have they done something similar with their families? **Develop**

We will find out how people prepare and celebrate Diwali. We will make our own diya's and create rangoli patterns. We will watch video clips of firework displays. We will print firework pictures with paint using a range of different tools and colours. We will make firework noises using voice sounds. We will use rockets for counting – forwards and backwards. We will draw fireworks outside on the floor with chalk. What if we were all the same?

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Learning Challenges

Read 'Happy Birthday Maisie'. Talk about how they celebrate their birthdays. We will explore numbers, particularly 3 and 4 relating to the children's ages. Find out how people prepare and celebrate Eid. Create some Eid decorations, make some traditional food and draw mendhi patterns. Read 'Golden Domes and Silver Lanterns' Read 'The First Christmas.' Find out about how people prepare for and celebrate Christmas. Learn Christmas rhymes and songs. Decorate Christmas tree in classroom. Innovate Thinking about what we have learnt about different celebrations, we will plan a party. Express We will make refreshments, decorations and prepare entertainment for the party. Have a party as a class. Take photos to share on Dojo. Take decorations home to share learning with families.

BUILDING LEARNING POWERS – how to make our brains grow! Noticing Persevering We will be using our Noticing skills to look closely at colour and pattern. The Persevering Pirates will be helping us to learn how to 'try, try and try again', particularly when putting on our coats as the weather gets colder. CHRISTIAN VALUES Compassion – we will be thinking about what compassion means to us and how we can show compassion to others. We will be looking at stories from the bible to help us understand more about what it means and how we can develop this value within ourselves. 'It's good to be kind'.
