<p>As historians we will be studying life during the Roman times and finding out about how the invasion of the Roman army changed the lives of the people living in Britain at the time.</p> <p>As scientists we will recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of different ways. We will explore and use classification keys to identify and name living things in their local and wider environment. We will also recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes be a problem.</p> <p>As mathematicians we will deepen our understanding of place value with numbers up to thousands. We will solve problems linked to addition and subtraction using written and mental calculations. We will also learn our times tables.</p> <p>In PSHE we will look at our feelings and the impact on others, making links with the zones of regulation. <p>We will be curious and ask suitable questions to deepen our learning in all subjects. We will strengthen our resourceful muscles as we share our ideas when making links between historical facts and distilling the information in our own writing to show we have understood. We will persevere as we learn our next steps in our year group skills, especially with times tables, spellings and handwriting.</p>	

As readers and writers, we will continue to develop our comprehension and vocabulary in all areas of reading and writing in a range of genres both fiction and non-fiction. We will study the novel 'Oliver and the Seawigs' by Philip Reeve.

As information technologists we will learn how to Code by programming instructions for a computer using Purple Mash. We will use the computer/iPad to research and present our learning.

In Religious Education we will be exploring if all churches are the same. We will visit St George's and look at the features of the church. We will be learning about Harvest and how our school's values link with it.

In PE (Physical Education) we will practise our ball skills when learning how to play rugby, working as a team to defend and attack.

In music we will learn how to play the ukulele. We will look at music notation and join in with songs.
